

## OPUS-PROJECTS WORKSHOP “READ ME FIRST” HANDOUT INFORMATION

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\*\*\*YOU MUST BRING YOUR LAPTOP TO THE WORKSHOP AND  
BE PRE-REGISTERED FOR THE WORKSHOP (not just the conference)\*\*\*

1. DO NOT PRINT ALL OF THE HANDOUT MATERIAL (much of it is simply for future reference)
2. If you are unable to download these files, don’t worry; they can be provided at the workshop.
3. I encourage you to copy ALL these handout files onto your laptop and bring them to the workshop. At least, please bring the following items:
  - a. the contents of the three folders (C15, C16, and Sct2) listed in the section called “OPUS Data For Download”; all three folders can be downloaded together as one zip file – each folder has two photos, one TXT file, and one .14O file (you will be using these RINEX and photo files to practice uploading data to a project)
  - b. “OPUS Manual” (it might be helpful to keep this handy for reference)
  - c. “OPUS Projects Training Handout” (you will be referring to this as we work on the workshop training project)
4. The only thing I encourage you to PRINT and bring in hardcopy is pages 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, and 55 of the 55-page training project handout (item “c” shown above).
5. As you start working with OPUS-Projects after the workshop, I encourage you to keep handy the manual (item “b” shown above); you might consider printing it, but we aware that it is 118 pages long, although it can be printed double-sided; the manual undergoes periodic revision.
6. Other files included are:
  - a. Presentations #s 1-5 (in PDF), which will be partially referenced during the workshop
  - b. OPUS-Projects glossary and hardware files – for your reference
